

# Current Agricultural Use Valuation (CAUV) Renewal Application

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All owners of property already enrolled in the CAUV program must also file a renewal form prior to the first Monday in March of every year to continue the current agricultural use valuation. Failure to file a renewal for the CAUV program may result in the removal of the parcel from the program and assessment of the recoupment charge.

If there have been any changes in either the property boundaries or the ownership of the parcel since the last renewal was filed, the owner must also file another Initial Application (DTE form 109) to register those changes with the County Auditor.

If you wish your parcel to remain fallow and have your land lay idle, or without agricultural production, please mark an "F" in the box on the renewal form next to the corresponding parcel number. According to the Ohio Revised Code you may claim fallow for one year without penalty. The parcel must then return to commercial agricultural production in the following year. If you claim fallow beyond one year your parcel will be removed from the program and you must then show good cause, as determined by the Board of Revision, to remain fallow beyond one year and still remain in the CAUV program.
