How can I participate in Franklin County's budget process?

The Franklin County Board of Commissioners approves the county's annual budget each fall. Prior to the budget's approval, the commissioners hold a series of budget hearings to encourage residents to provide input as the commissioners consider budgetary priorities. What does the Franklin County Board of Commissioners do?

The Franklin County Board of Commissioners serves as the administrative head of Franklin County Government. Together, the three-member board manages nearly \$1.2 billion in county funds, more than 130 county-owned buildings and serves as the county's sole contracting and taxing authority. How do I apply for a job with Franklin County?

Persons interested in posted employment opportunities in the board of commissioners' organization can apply by sending a resume or completing an employment application. How do I adopt a child in Franklin County?

Many adoptive families are needed in Franklin County for waiting children. Prospective parents can call (614) 341-6060 for more information or to get started in the process. The requirements to adopt are simple. Families can be single, married, widowed or divorced. Prospective parents should be at least 18 years of age, live Franklin County residents and be self-supporting.

How do I adopt a dog from the Franklin County Dog Shelter?

Prospective adopters can view dogs or puppies that are available for adoption by visiting the Dog Shelter during open hours or logging onto the Shelter' s Web site at www.FranklinCountyDogs.com. After approval is granted for the adoption, the dog receives all of the necessary vaccinations, a dog license, a leash, a matching collar and other goodies. Instructions are given for proper care and medical follow up by a veterinary technician. Call the Shelter at (614) 462-4361 for more information.

How can I become a foster parent in Franklin County?

Foster parents provide a vital service to children in this community and to Children Services. Interested families can call (614) 341-6060 for more information or to get started in the process. Prospective foster parents should be at least 21 years of age, live in Franklin County and be self-supporting. Families can be single, married, widowed or divorced.

Does Franklin County Dog Shelter accept cats or other animals?

The Franklin County Dog Shelter is a dog only facility. However, the Shelter will accept a cat or a wild animal if it has been involved in a bite to a human and needs to be tested for rabies. Call the shelter at (614) 462-4360 for more information.

How do I purchase a dog license?

Dog licenses can be purchased in person at the Franklin County Dog Shelter (1731 Alum Creek Dr.) or the Franklin County Auditor's Office (373 S. High St., 21st Floor). You can also apply online at www.franklincountyauditor.com or by calling the Consumer Services Division at (614) 462-3260. You must provide proof of a current rabies vaccination before you are able to purchase a dog license for any dog or puppy three months of age or older.

Where do I get a flu shot?

Can the Franklin County help with home repair?

Yes. Our Department of Community and Economic Development provides home rehabilitation loans to income eligible families in amounts up to \$25,000. This money can be used for the repair of major home systems such as windows, furnaces, siding, plumbing and electrical systems. Grants are also available under this program for the removal of lead-based paint hazards from the home. For more information, call (614) 462-5631.

Can Franklin County help me buy a home?

Yes. The Department of Economic Development's Down Payment Assistance program is designed to promote home ownership by providing up to \$5,000 in down payment and closing costs on new or existing homes. These funds are available to income eligible families who are purchasing a home in Franklin County (outside of the city of Columbus). For more information on these programs, call (614) 462-5631.

How do I receive mental health and substance abuse services available to the community?

ADAMH purchases care for Franklin County residents from mental health and recovery experts including more than 45 contract providers you know and trust located in neighborhoods throughout Franklin County. These community not-for-profit agencies provide quality mental health and alcohol/drug prevention and treatment services and are our community's safety net for recovery care. How do I get immediate help for a mental health or substance abuse emergency?

Individuals who are experiencing mental health, alcohol and drug abuse problems may contact ADAMH's front door, NetCare Access at (614) 276CARE (2273) 24 hours a day, seven days a week for crisis and assessment services in Franklin County.

How do I request paternity establishment through the CSEA?

If you are receiving Ohio Works First (OWF) benefits, the Franklin County Department of Job & Family Services will automatically refer your case to the CSEA for paternity establishment. If you are not receiving OWF benefits and are interested in pursuing paternity establishment and receiving follow-on child support services, you can request that an enrollment packet be mailed to you by calling the agency at (614) 462-3275.

What is the easiest way to establish paternity for my child?

If you are currently pregnant and facing an out-of-wedlock birth, you can contact the social worker at your prospective hospital for more information concerning in-hospital, paternity establishment (post delivery) through completion of the Acknowledgment of Paternity Affidavit. This is the quickest method available for paternity establishment. However, in order to go this route, the baby's father must be willing to cooperate and must sign the affidavit.

How do I find out personal property tax due dates?

When Form 920 is timely filed with the county auditor, one-half of the total tax must be paid at the time of filing. The county treasurer mails a bill for the second half balance due. The concluding payment is due September 20th. How do I estimate how much a proposed property tax levy will cost me?

How do I obtain a real estate tax reduction as a senior citizen?

Homeowners who are age 65 or older who meet income eligibility guidelines may qualify for a property tax reduction. Call the treasurer's office at (614) 462-3240 to learn more.

How do I make a partial payment on my real estate taxes or establish a delinquent tax payment plan?

Recent legislation now allows the county treasurer to accept partial payments. Any partial payment sent will be credited to your account; however, penalties and interest will continue to accrue on any unpaid balance. Delinquent tax payment plans are available under certain circumstances. How do I register to vote?

- At any public high school or vocational school
- At the offices of designated agencies which provide public assistance or disability programs
- Public libraries

- By mail

You may request a registration form from a board of elections or the secretary of state's office by mail, telephone or in person. How do I report a gasoline pump, price scanner or retail scale that I think is operating incorrectly?

Anyone can report child abuse or neglect by calling our 24-hour hotline number at (614) 229-7000. Abuse reports can remain anonymous. Any professional working with children is mandated to report suspected abuse or neglect.

Where do I report suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of the elderly?

In Franklin County, incidents of suspected abuse, neglect or exploitation of the elderly should be reported to Adult Protective Services (APS) at (614) 462-4348, Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and evenings, weekends and holidays leave a voice message at (614) 462-4356.

The "Senior Citizen Information Handbook," provided by the Franklin County Office on Aging, is designed to link Franklin County's older adults and their families with services that promote independent living. How would I locate services for my elderly parent who lives alone in Franklin County?

Franklin County Senior Options helps Franklin County older adults age 60 and older remain independent and safe in their homes by providing community based services. A single call to (614) 462-6200 can link older adults and their families with a case manager who can answer questions, determine the current need, and create a plan for services. Services are provided on a cost-sharing basis to those with a demonstrated need.

How do I obtain a marriage license?

Both marriage applicants must apply in person, together. The license may be obtained in this county if one of the applicants is a resident of Franklin County and the license may be used anywhere in the State of Ohio. This Court will also issue the license if neither of the applicants is a resident of the State of Ohio, but the marriage ceremony must take place in Franklin County. The minimum age for applying for a license in Ohio, without parental consent, is eighteen (18) years of age. No blood tests or physical examinations are required in Ohio. To begin your license application, visit www.franklincountyohio.gov/probate/index.cfm/ and click on "Marriage Application."

How do I file personal property tax returns for my business?
