

CLASSROOM G300 INTERMEDIATE ICS FOR EXPANDING EVENTS

Hosted by: Franklin County Emergency Management Agency

Course Description: This 21-hour classroom course provides training for personnel who require advanced application of the Incident Command System (ICS) and Individuals who may assume a supervisory role in incidents. This course expands upon information covered in the ICS 100 and ICS 200 courses.

Recommended Participants: FEMA designed this course for individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents or Type 3 incidents.

Note: During a Type 3 incident, some or all of the Command and General Staff positions may be activated, as well as Division/Group Supervisor and/or Unit Leader level positions. These incidents may extend into multiple operational periods.

Required Prerequisites: Individuals must complete the IS-100.c Introduction to the Incident Command System, IS-200.c Basic Incident Command System for Initial Response, IS-700.b An Introduction to the National Incident Management System and IS-800.c National Response Framework courses prior to attending the G300 Intermediate course. **Copies of their certificates of completion must be sent to Pam Tickle, pktickle@franklincountyohio.gov, after registering for the class for final approval to attend the course.**

Enrollment: Students must enroll using their OHID account through the Ohio Learn System via the [Ohio EMA Training Schedule](#) website. Course registration typically closes 10 business days prior to the course start date, and applicants may check their enrollment and approval status through the Ohio Learn System website.

Course Costs: There is no charge for participants attending this course. However, Lodging, Meals, Per Diem and all other travel expenses are the responsibility of the student or the parent organization.
