Course Objective:

Describe National Continuity Policy, continuity guidance, directives, and background; Identify the roles and responsibilities of key personnel involved in developing and maintaining a continuity plan; Describe the essential function identification process; Describe how to conduct a Business Process Analysis (BPA) and Business Impact Analysis (BIA); Identify mitigation options to reduce an organization's risk and key planning elements to support those options and Demonstrate knowledge of key concepts and strategies for developing and maintaining a viable continuity plan.

Required Prerequisites: Individuals must complete the IS-1300 Introduction to Continuity of Operations course prior to attend this course; **applicant can access the IS-1300 Introduction to Continuity of Operations course at <https://training.fema.gov/is/courseoverview.aspx?code=IS-1300&lang=en>.**
